

COURSE OPTIONS FOR ENGLISH/SECONDARY EDUCATION MAJORS

The scheduling for this track is quite restricted because of the state's requirements for teaching certification. Careful planning is essential for timely graduation. Most courses for this track are offered only in the fall or only in the spring, and you will need to enroll in these courses when they are offered in order to graduate on time. These more restricted required courses rotate as follows:

Fall semester only: ENGL 3681, 3002, 3004, 3101, 3110, 3120, 3820; SCED 4102

Spring semester only: ENGL 4720, 3001, 3003, 3102, 3310; SCED 4101, 4501

Extra sections of these above courses may be offered, but they are not guaranteed: if you see one of these required courses on the course schedule, you should enroll in it to make sure your graduation is not delayed.

Some upper-division courses, including the English literature surveys (ENGL 3001, 3002, 3003, or 3004), are sometimes offered during the summer, so there is some flexibility possible within the configuration provided below. ENGL 4420 (Shakespeare) and ENGL 3320 (Children's Literature) are offered both fall and spring, so you may enroll in these courses at any time.

* Courses to fulfill these requirements are offered in both spring and fall, but fall enrollment is recommended due to the more restricted rotation of required ENGL and SCED courses in the spring

** The same course cannot count for two different requirements: for example, if you take ENGL 3004 to fulfill an English literature requirement, you may not use ENGL 3004 to fulfill a contemporary literature requirement. If you take ENGL 3310 (Women's Literature) to fulfill a minority literature requirement, you may not use it to fulfill the contemporary literature requirement.
